PARKING DO'S AND DONT'S.....

Please use the south parking lot when arriving at school with a vehicle. Pay attention to the *No Parking* signs and yellow and blue curbing in front of the school. These areas are NOT to be used to park vehicles, attended or unattended, for any length of time. By-law enforcement and the Fire Department authorities help us monitor this area throughout the year and can issue \$80 parking tickets.



Also, do not enter the bus lane when dropping off or picking up your child, specifically between 8:15 – 8:55 and again between 3:00 – 3:40. If you are parked behind the Rec Center or Community Hall, use the sidewalk to go to and from the school. For safety reasons we ask all students to do this, so the adults must as well.

VISITORS IN THE BUILDING...

As many are already aware, AHS has mandated health and safety protocols that we are all getting used to, especially here in an elementary school. All visitors must enter through the main front doors, not be sick or have symptoms, must wear a mask, sanitize their hands at the entrance, and proceed directly to the office to sign in. All school doors are locked most of the day, so visitors will have to ring the doorbell.

STUDENT ILLNESS – IF A STUDENT HAS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

If you have any of these symptoms you are legally required to isolate for at least 10 days from the start of your symptoms or until they resolve, whichever is longer:

- Fever
- Cough (new cough or worsening chronic cough)

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing (new or worsening)
- Runny nose
- Sore throat

If you have any of these other symptoms, stay home and minimize your contact with others until your symptoms resolve:

- Chills
- Painful swallowing
- Stuffy nose
- Headache
- Muscle or joint aches
- Feeling unwell, fatigue or severe exhaustion
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or unexplained loss of appetite)
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Conjunctivitis, commonly known as pink eye

Note: When symptoms arise and pre-existing medical conditions are present (like asthma and allergies for example) these situations are handled differently.

JOIN OUR SCHOOL COUNCIL:

Our first WES School Council meeting this year will be held Wednesday, September 23, 2020 @ 5:30pm. This will be an in-person meeting in the school library. In order to attend, you must be feeling well, free of COVID-19 symptoms, wear a mask to enter and move through the building, and sanitize your hands at the entry. Once seated in the library, masks can be removed as long as you are physically distanced and remain seated. You won't sign in at the front office, names of attendees will be taken at the meeting.

I'M GOING TO BE AWAY...

Using your child's Agenda or sending a note for your child's homeroom teacher letting them know when daily routines are going to change, is an excellent way to communicate. This greatly reduces the chance that a message gets lost. When this is absolutely NOT possible and information has to be passed along to children please call the office **BEFORE 3:00 PM**, leaving office staff sufficient time before dismissal.



If you know ahead of time of an appointment for your child, please notify the homeroom teacher. Should an absence not be known in advance please call the school first thing in the morning as attendance is done by 9:15 AM.

Any student arriving after 10:30am will be absent on the attendance for that morning. If students must leave before 2:00 pm they will be marked absent for the afternoon.

Breakfast Program...No Den

Our school canteen known as the Den is not available at this time. With COVID-19 related protocols, we are no sure when or if the Den will re-open.

However, we are excited to once again offer a breakfast snack to all interested students beginning Monday, September 14. Healthy, nutritious choices will be featured including dry cereal, milk, and fruit. We look to add yogurt, cheese, and eggs (or other protein items) as we get the program up and running.
