## Third Wave Update...

Even now with at-home learning, we continue to follow rigorous protocols and practices making the school a safe place.

WES has received confirmation of a total of six positive cases of COVID-19 in the April 22 -May 7 time frame. The isolation/quarantine lift dates were/are May 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> for the first two cases, May 13 for cases three and four, and May 19 for the two most recent cases. With each confirmed case Alberta Health Services (AHS) requires the school to determine the close contacts, notify them as soon as possible, and submit paperwork in a timely manner. The logistics surrounding this are complex and inevitably some pieces of communication are not effective or lost altogether. Once again, thank you for your patience and understanding.
